Who is the course targeted at:

The course is aimed at individuals who wish to gain a greater understanding of how we can use events in international history to understand the issues that Northern Ireland may face in dealing with its past.

What is involved?

This course will run for 10 weeks with each session lasting 3 hours.

Requirements for course accreditation are:

Participants will be required to complete a ‘Personal Learning Journal’ which demonstrates reflective learning gained in class and 3 assignments.

Successful participants will be awarded a Level 3 accreditation with the Open College Network.

Each course will have no more than 14 participants.



Course Content

- Components involved in the formation of one’s identity.
 - How people can be excluded because of their identity
 - Identify and review political economic and social changes that that have taken place in N Ireland since 1921 and their implications.
 - Recognise an event as a key turning point in N.Ireland in the period from 1969 to the present.
 - The role of the ‘bystander’ and analysis of why people bystand.
 - The role of the ‘upstander.’
 - How a country’s past influences its present and future identity.
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
